### **EDUCATION DEPARTMENT**

For 2009, the Educa tional Star goals have been updated to crisply align our district effort to the most critical national initiatives. The

3 goals for each squadron are: Boat Operator Certification: Qualify an Advanced Certifier and 2 Inland **Navigators** 

- · On-Water Courses: Offer on-water Seamanship, Sail, Piloting or Paddle-smart.
- · New Members in Class: Increase % of new members completing classes in 1<sup>st</sup> twelve months. Each of these goals is critical to membership growth and retention.
- · Boat Operator Certification:
  - o The national vision is to expand recognition and membership growth by demonstrating USPS capabil ity to implement a broad-based BOC program responsive to emerging USCG needs.
  - o The first 3 levels of operator certification are applicable to local D10 waters:

Inland Navigator (small lakes and rivers), Coastal Navigator (Mississippi River system and Great Lakes along shore) and Advanced Coastal Navigator (Great Lakes crossings). Progression requires Certifier verification of course/seminar completion and Advanced Certifier verification of demonstrated on-water skills.

### o Here's the 2009 D10 plan for Certifier/Advanced Certifier Development:

Prospective Certifiers & Advanced Certifiers must attend Certifier training. This was offered at the 2008 Spring Conference and will be offered again at this year's Spring Conference. § Prospective Advanced certifiers must be qualified on Safe Powerboat Handling skills. This qualification will be accomplished during multi-squadron spring events to be led by Art Mollica for Minnesota squadrons and Bill Dohr for Wisconsin squadrons. Both Certifiers & Advanced Certifiers must be qualified instructors. A re-certification seminar will be offered at the Spring conference. (Continued Page 5)

### o Here's the 2009 D10 plan for Inland Navigator Development:

After spring training, Advanced Certifiers can begin local qualification of members on Safe Powerboat Handling and Fire Extinguisher skills. A major portion of the Summer Rendezvous program will be devoted to member qualification on these skills (All Advanced Certifiers in support). SEOs are to structure 2009 courseseminar offerings to help prospective Inland Navigators to fill open course or seminar requirements (S, EM, ME 101, Chart, Onboard Weather, GPS, VHF).

- o *Key point:* Each squadron needs an Advanced Certifier. To be an Advanced Certifier, individuals need Certifier training and Instructor Re-certification (both offered at Spring Conference) and safe Powerboat Handling skills qualification to be offered prior to the Summer Rendezvous on dates to be specified by Art Mollica and Bill Dohr.
- •On-water course: Squadrons in other districts have found that use of on-water courses has significantly increased membership recruiting results.
- •New member course completion %: Clearly, prompt involvement of new members in squadron programs is a key to retention. Here's an example calculation:
  - o If a squadron had 12 new members in 2007 (completed their 1<sup>st</sup> twelve months in 2008) and 4 of these completed a class by their 1<sup>st</sup> anniversary, the 2008 metric would be 33%.
  - o If that same squadron then had 4 new members in 2008 (completed their 1<sup>st</sup> twelve months in 2009) and 2 of these completed a class by their 1<sup>st</sup> anniversary, the 2009 metric would be 50%.
  - o In this case, the squadron would meet the Ed star requirement because the % increased (even though the number declined).

Striving to meet these goals should help add excitement to being a D10 USPS member. Good luck with your squadron programs and with your individual BOC efforts! Let's take this opportunity to lead the way.
