## **District Educational Department**


Patsy & I have spent between 2 and 4 months on the road for each of the last few years, mostly seeing the southern US while the boat is sleeping in the shed. We also use the trip to travel to the USPS Annual Meeting. We have a Lance truck camper, which has all the systems of a full size travel trailer, including a slide out, but not the square footage. Having come up from motorcycles, tents, and boat interiors, we're not seriously impacted by the closeness, so to us it's huge. Heck, we even have a 50 pound dog inside. However, one does need to have an unconditional high regard for one's mate and a cooperative nature.

Because we travel so much, we have to be able to conduct business on the road. I'm a serious student of the stock market, so I'll have a laptop, a small TV that doubles as a second screen, (and a news source), an android phone that works as a traveling wi-fi hotspot, and be getting a couple of feeds from the exchanges, and a small note pad. On her half, Patsy has her Apple and a video camera. The point is, we have to be flexible, eating, working, sleeping, and securing for travel in a very small space. When I took on the DEO job for a second time, I knew it would only be for one year, which is a short time in a pretty complicated position. Consequently, I kind of viewed myself as a transitional figure. I would be fleshing out some of my predecessors' programs, and generally keeping the trains running on time. Ah, but as I've alluded to before, the winds of change are flowing strongly in our organization. In addition to Boat Operator Certification and Brunswick, major parts of the educational data system are under revision and are incompatible with the old. Flexibility and prioritization have been key ingredients this past year.

At the annual meeting we were introduced to a new Boat Operator Certification regimen. Our current Advanced Certifiers will become Inland Navigator Certifiers, but will lose the ability to clone themselves. It seems that as we went 2 or 3 iterations into certifying certifiers, we had the telephone message prob-

lem, in that the message became diluted. Further Inland Navigator Certifiers and all Coastal Navigator Certifiers will be trained by special teams. Also at the annual meeting there was some indication that the parameters for the pilot project for Brunswick may be loosening, which may allow us to expand the program to other squadrons. We will be trying to





get a better fix on this approaching spring conference. Finally, there is a new HQ800 system to replace the public boating data infrastructure (and a soon to be released Boating Course Assistant) which will need to be understood and communicated.

A leader is only as good as his supporting staff. My able assistant, D/1<sup>st</sup>/Lt Bob Denoto, JN is as strong a second as one could ever hope for, and will make an absolutely outstanding DEO. He's run a "First in the Nation" effort at the squadron level, and has been an active partner in the running of the department. P/ D/C Maury Rice, JN has been our ABC coordinator for Wisconsin and handled those duties with aplomb. D/Lt Sandy Columb, AP, has done a similarly outstanding job as ABC Coordinator for Minnesota. And she's been doing it since I recruited her the first time I was DEO. And of course, I don't want to forget our SEO's, who actually make it all happen.

Finally, my new Squadron, Door County, has asked me to come in as their Executive Officer, so I will continue to have an excuse to see all my friends.

## District Administrative Officer

Membership related issues are always important in the Administrative Department. As of 31 December 2010, our membership is 1226. This is a loss of 104 members from the same date in 2009. Two squadrons in the district had net increases in membership. Congratulations go to St Paul for 8.7% growth; and to Sheboygan for coming in 5<sup>th</sup> place in Group 3 of the National Growth Award. This award used to recognize the top 10% of Squadrons that grew their membership, and it still does that. Now however, it divides squadrons into 3 groups by size: above 149 members is group 1, 60 -148 members is Group 2; and 60 members and below is Group 3. District 10 intends to follow the lead of National and will revise our award structure.

Three squadrons submitted entries for the Membership Involvement and Retention Award (MIRA). Though none were award winners, I would like to recognize Milwaukee, Oshkosh, and St Paul for their efforts. People that are constantly looking for ways to engage our membership are the key to our future.

Another new program is the "Doing it Right" Award, or DIR. Over the years the National Membership Committee has developed a list of what healthy squadrons do to ensure their growth from year to year. This list was used by the National Membership Committee (MEMCOM) as the basis for developing the questionnaire for the Doing It Right Award. Our district had 3 squadrons submit entries this year; they were Duluth, Milwaukee and Minnetonka. They could answer yes to the required 15 questions; the bar will be higher by one more next year. Members of D10 will be hearing a lot more about this program in the near future, as elements of it are likely to appear in the coming year's Star Squadron Program.

Another program of the Membership Committee is the Boarman Youth Poster Contest. D10 continues its wining ways by taking a 3<sup>rd</sup> place award in the 9-11 year category. We would like to congratulate Kade Retterath from Mound MN, for his efforts. You may recognize the name; Kade won his category last year. My thanks to all of those people who went out and got the kids to participate. We all know that involved kids are future members.

There were lots of fun events around the district this year. Most of the boating related activities around the district were placed on the calendar in Sail Angle. This meant that if you had a weekend where you didn't know what to do, you could access the calendar and find something. Thanks to Suzanne Carman for her efforts.

Speaking of boating activities, many thanks go to the Duluth Sail and Power Squadron for hosting the 2010 D10 Rendezvous. If you didn't make it, you missed a fabulous event. You get another chance this year in Sturgeon Bay, 5-7 August 2011, hosted by Door County Sail and Power Squadron. This weekend coincides with the Wooden Boat Show. Don't miss it! I would like to thank members of my own squadron, Madison Sail and Power Squadron, for hosting the 2010 D10 Spring Conference. It was a special weekend for us, because it was our 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration, and because one of our own, Jim Pahl-Washa, was sworn in as District Commander.

Thanks also to Green Bay Sail and Power



Squadron, who hosted the 2010 D10 Fall Conference in Green Bay. It was a wonderful event with great food, and lots of different activities, both on and off site.

## Bits and Pieces from the "Office" of the Treasurer

#### **Certificates of Insurance**

You probably already know that USPS insurance (through the Chub Insurance Group) provides coverage for districts and squadrons that use property owned by others for classrooms, meeting and other events. But did you also know how easy it is to obtain a Certificate of Insurance? When evidence of insurance is required by a property owner or lessor, you (any member) can complete the certificate of insurance request form **and submit it on line**. I've heard that turnaround has been as little as two days! Here are seven simple steps:

- 1. Go to USPS.org
- 2. Go to the Site Index
- 3. Select "Insurance Information"
- 4. Validate that you are a member, as required
- 5. Select "Certificate of Insurance Request Form"
- 6. Complete the form
- 7. Click to Submit by Email

#### QuickBooks

This is a quick reminder that every squadron in District 10 is eligible for reimbursement when buying a copy of QuickBooks through Tech Soup. You may also receive reimbursement when you buy any type of QuickBooks user guide or manual.
