From the Helm...

The District Commander's takeaways from the 2015 Fall Governing Board Meeting in San Diego, CA

Recognizing budgetary issues on the National level, Chief Commander's representatives will no longer be sent to attend district conferences at which there is no Change of Watch, For D/10, this means there will not be a C/C's Rep at our Fall Conferences for the foreseeable future. The Board of Directors (National Bridge) is investigating how to communicate with our USPS membership via remote methods. Chief Commander Robert Baldridge, SN will hold a remote "Town Hall" with us during the Fall Conference weekend.


The Educational Department has made changes to the America's Boating Course, to the Instructor Development course (this is different from Instructor Recertification), and to the Junior Navigation and Navigation courses. Consult with your Squadron Educational Officer to assure that your squadron is keeping up with all the latest revisions.

Be aware that USPS Headquarters has changed the pricing structure of the USPS University Seminars quite radically. On the surface, it may seem that prices were reduced. Caution, there are added fees per student so check with your SEO before you publicize the costs for the Seminars you will be presenting.

Help District 10 achieve Educational Fund Honor Roll status. Several D/10 squadrons are not enrolled in the Educational Fund program. We have until November 30th to enroll. Go to the Educational Fund web page on the National website to find out how to enroll and what the Educational Fund is about. By contributing just \$1.00 per year per member, we support many of the educational initiatives within our Unites States Power Squadrons[®]. Enrolling before Nov. 30th will make your squadron eligible for Honor Roll status in 2015.

Many squadrons around the country locate their boat show booth in close proximity to the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary booth. Your squadron may want to do the same. Both of our organizations have teaching boating safety as our primary mission.

This is my first message to the members as your District 10 Educational Officer. As a rookie on the District bridge, I am honored to have been asked to serve as your DEO. There has been a lot of activity in this department in the first half of this year and most of it is very positive.

ABC3 Has Approval of NASBLA for Next 3 Years

District 10 Educational Department has been involved in completing new requirements of the latest agreement reached by USPS and NASBLA (National Association of Safety Boating Law Administrators). The agreement is for three years (2015 – 2017). ABC has been revised to conform to terms of the deal. USPS courses will include a state specific approved Power Point presentation in addition to the additional ten exam questions emphasizing state laws. Power Point submissions for approval (Minnesota and Wisconsin) were prepared and submitted. In the near future the presentations and state specific questions will be available for download on a secure site within the USPS website. Michigan documents have been prepared and submitted by D20. I believe the new documents will put all ABC instructors on the same page as we will be using the same Power Point presentations (pre-approved by our state).

District Executive Department

Facing Outward - and Forward

It's a pleasure and a privilege to be your District 10 Executive Officer, and here's why: It's my favorite department! The reason? We originally joined USPS because we boated with friends who were members. Then we took classes and learned a lot. And then came the decision point – why should I stay? For me, it was simple: This was my chance to do something to "give back," to engage in some kind of public service. And the Exec Department is all about how USPS faces outward, to the public. It's my favorite department!

At the national level, there are seven major Executive Department committees and multiple subcommittees to each, all devoted to helping Districts and Squadrons achieve visibility and name recognition and identifying initiatives that promote boating safety. I'd like to focus on three of them, especially within the context of what District 10 has been doing in their regard, or might do in the future.

Vessel Safety Checks

We all know having a Vessel Safety Check is a good idea. It forces us to make sure that we have everything we need, that we know where everything is, and that it's working correctly. When we offer this same peace of mind to non-USPS boaters, we have a great opportunity to look inside their boats *and* spread the good news about USPS.

According to national data, the 78 qualified Vessel Examiners of District 10 have reported completing

1,023 checks and awarding 912 decals (89%) so far this year. Our 2014 totals were 83 VEs, 1,227 checks and 1,050 decals (86%). With three months left to report completed checks, we could easily meet or beat last year's numbers.

The key phrase in the preceding paragraph is *left to report*. Did you know that each spring, each squadron is given new decals equal to 10% more than the number of checks <u>reported</u> the year before? And that squadrons requesting additional decals are given them immediately (without jumping through hoops) when their current number of <u>reported</u> checks validates the request for more?

And did you know that every VE can go online to record his own checks?



Geodetic Marker Recovery Program

It's back! I'm thrilled to reiterate the announcement that National has renewed/rejuvenated/ revived this element of the Cooperative Charting Program. We have fond memories of heading out in small teams on a sunny fall afternoon to search for the sometimes elusive 3" round disks embedded in concrete or stone, placed there to aid surveyors plying their trade. Armed with GPS, shovel, screw driver and tape measure, wearing our highway safety vests Those were the days!

This is a great opportunity for the District 10 Squadrons that are not on "big water" and therefore not totally able to participate in other aspects of the Co-op Charting program. The process is fairly simple: Download a list of nearby marker sites from





NOAA; Go out and find them; Go on line to report the condition you found them in. Then USPS National reviews all submittals and sends them on to NOAA to update/validate their records.

Update: D10's Electric Shock Drowning Awareness Program

Many of you are aware that District 10 has developed a program to increase boat and marina operator awareness of the very real risk of drowning as a result of electric shock. While our leaders' advocacy and efforts to have this program fully endorsed by the USPS National Safety Committee have been as yet unsuccessful, District 10 is moving forward with a modified program that will is train selected members of our Squadrons to:

- Communicate the dangers of ESD to marina operators and the boating public
- Warn all people to keep out of the water
- Perform straightforward tests to detect dangerous conditions in the water

Part of the initiative will be to contact and work with marina owners and operators to install signs that instruct and warn the boating community about Electric Shock Drowning.

- What happens next? How can your Squadron get on board with this important public service?
- Learn more about ESD by attending the seminar being led by Minnetonka's Ed Lethert at the Fall Conference.

Plan to attend a practical, hands-on ESD workshop at Spring Conference to learn how to perform tests and communicate results; and/or learn and practice the key communication points for working with marina operators and getting them to install warning signs.

Food for Thought:

While planning your activities and leadership for the coming Watch Year, consider creating an ESD committee to plan and execute your squadron's campaign to contact local marinas to educate them about Electric Shock Drowning and assist with placing warnings. Chairing such a committee could also be a great leadership development opportunity.

As I am writing this, the end of September and the 2015 boating season is near. We still have some beautiful fall color cruises to look forward to. We are so fortunate and need to count our blessings every day for what we have and the opportunity to get out on our boats and see the beautiful landscapes.

I love the variety and the changing seasons as I believe it keeps us appreciating the time we have in each. With the fall season comes new opportunities along with the Fall Conference on November 6-8. I do plan on attending the conference and look forward to seeing everyone from the district join together.

The financials of the district are thorough and strong. I anticipate we will meet our budget goals. We have half of the fiscal year to go, along with the fall conference com-

ing soon. We have realized approximately 85% of the budgeted revenue for the fiscal

year to date. Basically, this is the only revenue coming into the district budget. The District 10 Bridge works hard to follow the budget and be fiscally responsible to keep our fiscal position solid and our budgets balanced.

The District 10 Bridge and the Budget and Finance Committee are currently working on the next fiscal year's budget. This will be presented at the Fall Conference the first weekend in November. We are not planning on an increase in District Dues from the current \$19/year for Primary Active Members and \$26/year for Family Membership.

Overview of the Annual Budget Approval Process:

- 1. The Bridge & the Budget and Finance Committee work together with the Treasurer to propose a Budget for the coming year.
- 2. The Bridge & the Budget and Finance Committee review the proposed budget and make a recommendation to approve or revise based on available funds.
- 3. The Bridge reviews the Committee's recommendations and makes changes if required.
- 4. The council reviews/discusses and approves or disapproves the proposed Budget prior to the Fall Conference.
- 5. The Conference delegation reviews/discusses and approves or disapproves the proposed Budget at the Fall Conference.


