District Educational Department

As District 10 Education Officer, I want to invite you to our Spring Conference. I look forward to seeing all of you and I know that the St. Paul Sail & Power Squadron has been hard at work to make the weekend a great success as well as a worthwhile learning experience. I want to encourage you to attend as a "First Timer" or seasoned attendee. As with the last conference, we have made an effort to offer a full slate of events.

ABC3 (America's Boating Course) : Impact of the New Contract with NASBLA

USPS and NASBLA (National Association of Safety Boating Law Administrators) have a new agreement for three years (2015 – 2017). ABC has been revised to conform to terms of the deal. I invite and want to encourage you to attend my *Friday Afternoon Session* which will highlight revisions to our ABC3 course. I will present a few significant changes involved in the classroom, online version, examination, and reporting process of the program.

Instructor Re-certification

Al Wentworth and I will conduct an instructor re-certification session Saturday afternoon. We have several D-10 instructors in need of being re-certified. It is a requirement for anyone involved in teaching our public courses (especially ABC3) that instructors be certified. The re-certification process will take 2 hours and we will have a very meaningful session.

Please consider the scheduled session on the "Go to Meeting" process. The process is a great tool in providing our students with the online learning experience. One of my goals is to put the D-10 program in place which would offer education without having to venture out of the home. This session will present the process of using this valuable tool. After attending this seminar, you will not be intimidated by the process of initiating a "Go to Meeting" session. The tool is available to us as both a teaching tool and online meeting tool.

SEO Spring Conference Workshop

This is a call for all Squadron SEO's or assistant SEO's, and instructors to attend the Educational Department workshop. Please come and share your successes with your peers. I will be able to share information I received at the 2016 annual meeting Education Workshop and want to get much needed input from you. We in D-10 need to reverse the declining participation in our course offerings. We had fewer ABC completions this past year. Overall, all course enrollments have decreased in recent times. Please note: This workshop is also open to all attendees.

Seminar: Boating on Rivers, Locks, etc.

We will have a 2 hour session presenting the USPS seminar on river boating. It is very timely as we will once again be

Boating on Rivers, Locks, and Dams

The seminar deals with such varied topics as special navigation rules for rivers, the Western Rivers System of buoys and marks, river currents, "reading" a river, jetties and wing dams, the intricacies of locking through, and communicating with lock masters and bridge tenders.

Instructor Re-certification

This two hour session will present a variety of thought provoking items, providing all attendees with an active discussion. Specific discussion will target your need to motivate the student in appropriate ways and make the learning environment more meaningful to everyone involved. USPS Instructors must re-certify every four years. Certification is required when teaching the public and a NASBLA requirement for ABC3.

One thing I know is that greater retention of existing members contributed greatly – providing the platform that allowed new members to be considered growth. And almost every squadron had more new members this year than in a while. But why? What did we do right? How do we keep doing it? And, yes – We want to keep doing it! More members means more people actively promoting safer waters, and more people sharing the load of keeping our commitments as members of USPS.

At recent Changes of Watch, I've talked about four levels of competence – nothing I invented, but something I learned years ago as a rookie sales manager that's given me remarkable insight in many of life's endeavors.

- The first level is Unconscious Incompetence. At this stage, we're not doing things well and we don't know that we're not doing them well. (dumb and happy; ignorance is bliss)
- The second level is Conscious Incompetence. Now were know we're not doing things well and we challenge ourselves to make corrections. (painful; not so much fun)
- The third level is *Unconscious Competence*. Things are starting to go well, but we're not totally sure why. Maybe we changed several things and we're unsure which has made the difference, or the most difference. We're also not sure whether whatever worked is repeatable and will help us retain our new Competence, or even improve on it. (light at the end of the tunnel; time to party?)
- The fourth level is Conscious Competence. Things are going right, exactly as we want them to. And we know why everything is
 working and we are confident we can do it again and again. (hurrah!)

My take on all this, in relation to the changes in D10 membership trends, is that we've achieved the third level of Unconscious Competence during the last two years. As your 2016 D/C nominee, I'd like us to take this year to figure out why and make it happen again – and achieve that fourth level of Conscious Competence.

So I decided on **"Coming About"** as my theme for the coming watch year. There doesn't seem to be a great need to change course, but we may need to occasionally "come about" to make corrections that will facilitate staying on course over all and enjoying ourselves as we approach our desired destination. When sailing, we come about to adjust to what's happening around us – wind, current, weather, other boats – but we don't necessarily change where we're headed. Coming about is rarely random; it is intentional and it is mindful. And it requires the attention (and to some degree, the participation) of everyone in the boat.

This is my vision for District 10: That we stay the course, making moderate intermediate changes to more effectively achieve our goals. And that we do so together – mindfully and intentionally – moving from the state of unconscious to conscious competence.

Thank you in advance for your vote of confidence in my potential to be an effective Commander for District 10 in the coming watch year. I look forward to seeing you all soon, if not at the Spring Conference (1-3 April in St.Paul), then at the Rendezvous or at your local Squadron events.

Five Steps to Increase Member Participation in District 10 Events

Step 1: Charge good people to figure out why members would turn out or stay away.

In response to an alarm raised by the district administrative officer at last year's Spring Conference, and direction from the district commander, the Member Participation Task Force began work to:

- Determine what all members liked and disliked about district-supported events: Spring Conference, Fall Conference and Summer Rendezvous.
- Recommend to the Planning Committee actions to increase member participation.

Step 2: Ask the members.

When the Participation team met with the Planning Committee, the joint group agreed they would most likely win member support for district events if they proposed actions that reflected member preferences as expressed by survey rather than debate among the investigators. Aware that people hate surveys and unsolicited email, and that we lack email addresses for many members, the group selected the email survey as the best among imperfect instruments of understanding. They developed a survey with just 10 guestions that could be answered within five minutes, sending it to the 775 District 10 members with email addresses in the USPS national database. Forty-three of these emails were "bounced" because of invalid addresses, leaving us a population of 733 for our survey recipients. This survey received by far the largest member response of any District 10 communication within the last five years. A total of 146 members responded, providing 95% confidence that the opinions expressed reflected member preferences within 8% error. (For details, see the full survey report posted on the district website.)

Step 3: Identify changes that will offer what the members want.

District 10 members supported keeping all three district-sponsored events. Their survey responses indicated four changes as most likely to increase their participation:

- 1. Provide members the chance to learn something new and interesting at the Conference.
- 2. Hold the Conference at an appealing location. (2nd place tie).
- 3. Provide the chance for members to see people they like. (2nd place tie).
- 4. Reduce the cost of attending.

Step 4: Identify actions that will offer what the members want.

To provide these four changes, the Planning Committee identified the following actions:

- I. To provide the chance to learn something new and interesting.
 - a. Offer USPS seminars at each conference.
 - b. Engage effective trainers on timely topics at each conference.
 - c. Hold a challenging, boating-related event at each Rendezvous, with preliminary training provided as needed.
- II. To offer appealing locations and lower costs.
 - a. Establish multi-year booking commitments at hotels with desirable features and
 - reasonable costs at locations within a 4-hour drive for 90% of the members.
 - The Twin Cities is recommended as the Minnesota site, with the Embassy Suites West (site of the 2015 Fall Conference) as a top candidate or model for a longterm booking site.
 - Wausau is recommended as the Wisconsin site, with the Jefferson Street Inn as a top candidate or model for a long-term booking site.
 - b. Have district officers arrange for room rates, conference rooms, audio-visual equipment, meals, receptions & entertainment as terms for the long-term booking commitments.
 - c. Have sponsor duty rotate among squadrons, with the option for smaller squadrons to share sponsor duties (such as registration, welcoming and entertainment planning), and fund-raiser opportunities (such as raffles and auctions).
 - d. Convert all meals to buffet style to the extent that such a move would reduce cost.
- III. To enhance the chance of members' seeing people they like.
 - Use Facebook and other social media to provide information and generate "buzz" for each event.
 - b. This media would provide details on attendees, activities, presenters, seminars, nearby attractions.

Step 5: Validate recommendations and pursue accordingly.

We are now at this step. During the Saturday session of the 2016 Spring Conference, members will receive an overview of this report and have the opportunity to confirm, modify or outright reject the actions listed in step 4.

- Confirmation will encourage district leaders to take those actions.
- Modification will tune those actions for implementation by district leaders.
- Rejection will sustain the hits and misses of past efforts, and leave the path open for better proposals.
