View from the Helm

As our District and Squadrons have come off a very successful and award winning watch year, there couldn't be a more exciting time to be a member of our organization. There is a lot of activity surrounding my theme of **REDEFINE TRADITION** at all levels of the organization. The National organization has adopted a Strategic Transition Plan to transform the organization to one that will better resonate with today's boaters. Key elements include America's Boating Club,



organizational and procedural simplification, and a cultural shift towards less formality and more fun. This resonates well with many of our own D10 initiatives including America's Boating Club, Living the Logo, and now our D10 Task Force. Speaking of the Task Force, all eleven squadrons have assigned representatives to support the initiative. The mission of the team is to *"look at potential changes in our operations to free up resources to focus on positioning D10 for the future"*. The group is meeting every other week. Accomplishments so far include: (1) wW agreed that there are underlying issues that need to be addressed and that the outcome of the Task Force can be successful at addressing some of those issues. (2) We brainstormed and identified the key problems within our District which when sorted and grouped boil down to marketing to get new members, member involvement to retain existing members, too much bureaucracy, and not enough focus on having fun and on what is important. Our next steps are to identify root causes for these issues followed by a move to corrective action recommendations. I will continue to talk about progress through future communications and it will be a topic at the Fall Conference hosted by Central Wisconsin.

Spring Conference Thanks!

A big THANKS to all who attended the Spring Conference in Minneapolis. We had a great time and continued to **REDEFINE TRADITION** with (1) shortened department workshops, (2) an on-time meeting, (3) great seminars, (4) a Saturday afternoon dedicated to fun social activity, (5) a great sponsor in Erickson Marine, and (6) a very positive Breakfast with the Bridge discussion. Special thanks to Minnetonka and Cdr Andy Lalim for hosting, and also to R/C Mike Skelley for representing the Chief Commander. Due to the generosity of Minnetonka (who agreed to split any proceeds with D10), the Enrichment Fund will realize an \$800+ increase! If your squadron has a need, fill out an application. Up to \$500 can be granted per year. There are several fun pictures from the Change of Watch later in this publication.

D10 Goals/Membership – Pretty big news here. D10 membership as of the end of June is 950 up 7.3% on the year. I looked back in time and you have to go back 6 years to see membership in our District at this high a level. Our two largest squadrons are leading the way with growth of 19% and 17% for Duluth and Minnetonka respectively. M/M is also up at 3.6%. Central Wisconsin and Green Bay are holding their own with the remainder being down for the year. We set a lofty goal this year to beat the amazing 2018 total of 114 new members. This was after adding 67 members in 2017. We are well on our way to smashing that goal having added 101 new members just half way through the year. The first chart on the right shows just how well we are doing compared to 2017 and 2018. 2019 is shown by the green line in the chart. Membership retention on the other hand continues to be an issue and we are behind our goal of improving retention this year. The second chart on the right shows retention through June which stands at 93.7% which is behind both 2017 and 2018. That means we have lost 6.3% which is 56 members to date. I continue to believe member involvement, new member mentoring programs, personal contact with members, and more opportunities for fun engagement are keys to retention. We also have to make sure our organization is offering a product that adds value for our members. These are all areas being discussed in the Task Force effort I mentioned above. If you have ideas, please





share them either directly with me, with your Commander, or your Task Force representatives. If you don't know who that is, let me know that as well at <u>dave.fine@ngc.com</u>

I certainly hope you are finally enjoying the summer boating season. It had a slow start but I believe the cold rainy period has finally subsided.

Jump Start: A New Program for All USPS Members

You may have heard about this new USPS training program. This is a fantastic way of giving new boaters an opportunity to learn by way of "on the water" education. As for instructors, any knowledgeable USPS member can conduct the training. The knowledge we can pass on to these boaters can lead to a lasting bond with them. They may even want to be-

come a USPS member! Marketing the program is a key element for success. Minnetonka Sail & Power Squadron has been out front in this effort with utilization of their website. Under their Education Icon is "Free on the Water Training". Inquirers will be asked to fill out an online questionnaire. Their SEO gets notification and can respond to them. The website is a very economical way of connecting with these struggling boaters. In 2019 they currently have 12 signups with an expected goal of 25. An estimated 60-70% of those signups lead to encouraged completion of our ABC3 (America's Boating Course). Proceeding to give them a VSC (Vessel Safety Check) and address the training needs with an informal interview is paramount. Mentoring doesn't require any certification. The mentor only needs to have the necessary skills to aid in the training session. I encourage you to approach your Squadron Educational Officer if interested.
