We are also a District that is committed to see our organization thrive far into the future! Read on to see how we did on our D10 goals, some fun highlights from the National Meeting in Orlando last month, and a look at what we have in store for our Spring Conference in April.

D10 Goals

My theme for the year was "**REDEFINE TRADITIONS... FROM STEM TO STERN**". I am happy to report that with the help of a great Bridge, dedicated Squadron Commanders, Council members, and all of you, we had an outstanding year. We started 2018 by aligning ourselves around 26 goals aimed at enhancing membership for all of us, while allowing our organization to resonate with a new generation passionate about boating, community service, and having fun with family and friends on the water. I am happy to report we achieved 24 of those goals (see scorecard at the end of this article). This is a great indication that D10 is healthy and moving in the right direction.



#### **National Meeting Highlights**

I recently had the honor of joining 21 D10 members in Orlando at the National meeting. It is clear our District is leading the way on several fronts. We were asked once again to make a presentation sharing our journey to transition to America's Boating Club including our efforts to "Live the Logo". There was significant interest and engagement during our presentation, and we received positive feedback. Likewise we were asked to share our successes with the new on the water Jump Start training program. Again, the audience was very engaged. Both of these initiatives are critical to our future and I want to thank District Marketing Chair Kevin Shutes for his leadership in driving both of these presentations.




<u>Awards</u> - District 10, our Squadrons, and members really turned up the gain this year and came away with 40 different awards! The District highlights included winning the Boat US Civic Award (considered the most prestigious award in all of the USPS), 2<sup>nd</sup> place in the nation for growth (we were first in total added members), 4<sup>th</sup> place VSC (outstanding considering we only boat about 5 months a year), and finally we were one of only 2 Districts that were recognized for having 100% of our Squadrons make the Education Fund Honor Roll. Our District also submitted Don Duncan of Minnetonka for the Chapman Award (highest recognition for an educator), and he won. Congratulations Don!

Two other highlights from the National Meeting to pass along:

<u>Fall National Governing Board Optional</u> – A vote was brought to the floor to make the fall national meeting optional. That passed unanimously. The 2019 meeting in Louisville will go on as planned, but future meetings are TBD.

<u>Strategic Transition Plan</u> – Our very own Mike Skelley is the Chair of the National Planning Committee and presented a transition plan for the National organization aimed at addressing the membership and operating issues faced by our greater organization. That plan continues to move forward. I asked Mike to present this in a seminar at our Spring Conference, so plan to attend to get the entire scoop.



## **District Educational Department**

#### SEO Spring Conference Workshop (Saturday 7:45 -8:30 AM)

This is a call for all Squadron SEO's or assistant SEO's, and instructors to attend the Educational Department workshop. Please come and share your successes with your peers. I will be able to share information I received at the 2019 annual meeting Ed. Workshop and want to get much needed input from you. We in D-10 need to reverse the declining participation in our course offerings. Overall, all course enrollments have decreased in recent times. Please note: This workshop is also open to all attendees.

#### Seminar: Emergencies on Board (Saturday 1:00 – 2:00 PM)

Learn how to adequately prepare for common emergencies and deal with them when they occur. Gain practical knowledge about accident prevention, running aground, onboard fires, getting lost, towing, and medical emergencies. A must-have for skippers, this seminar provides valuable skills for anyone venturing on the water. The seminar comes with a full color Student Guide for the seminar.




