
National Boat Safety Week May 21-27

Changing Course is Commander Lowney's theme for this year, and in keeping with that theme there is some rather significant changes being considered at National. In 2021, the organization created an Ad Hoc Committee reporting to the National Bridge to look at operational changes to improve our organization and to secure our future. The focus is on how to better support the 300+ clubs across the nation. We are facing many challenges including:

- Scarce resources, hard to fill positions
- Too much red-tape and bureaucracy
- Members' needs not being met
- Declining membership
- Squadrons/Clubs want more support
- Re-focus on mission, fun, and boating

To address these challenges, the Ad Hoc Committee established the following goals for reorganization:

- Increase member recruitment and retention
- Keep members satisfied and engaged
- Bolster the capabilities of local clubs to market and deliver boating education
- Where necessary, provide education directly to individual members
- Increase opportunities for members to participate in boating events and social activities
- Improve communication with all members
- Preserve and strengthen club capabilities to serve their members
- Reduce red-tape and bureaucracy to streamline services, administration, and coordination
- Provide better marketing and management tools to clubs

The overall strategies to achieve these goals are as follows:

- Improve support to clubs from National departments
- Streamline club operations
- Simplify entire organizational structure






